ONLINE SHOPPING

Online shopping has grown in popularity because it is convenient and easy to order the products we need. Older adults can sometimes lack confidence, not being familiar with the technology used to shop online or issues like scams and unreliable websites. Given technology training and understanding, many older adults are very pleased they have 'converted' wholly or partly. Online shopping has made a wonderful addition to their lives.

Benefits of online shopping

Online shopping offers <u>numerous benefits</u> for older <u>people</u>, including convenience, access to a wider range of products, and the ability to shop from the comfort of your own home. It allows older people <u>to compare prices</u> in an unhurried manner, read reviews and make informed purchasing decisions, all the while avoiding crowded stores and heavy lifting.

How many older people are using online shopping & what products are they purchasing?

Research is showing, 75% of people aged 65 & over have made online purchases in the past year. The most commonly purchased items by older people online include clothing, health & beauty products, electronics

and groceries. Even if you enjoy personal shopping, perhaps learning how to online shop is a good idea, so if and when there are mobility issues, a shopping change will not become a major issue and you can retain some of your independence.

How SAFE is ONLINE SHOPPING for an older person?

Online shopping can be safe for older people if they take the necessary precautions. It is important to use **reputable websites**, (Woollies, Coles, David Jones, Bunnings, Office Works, Myers etc) ensuring the website is secure (look for 'https' in the URL) and avoid clicking on suspicious links or popups! Keep your computer security software up-to—date & use strong, unique passwords for each online account. Never use the same password for different accounts. Always use a credit card (Visa/Mastercard). It offers more protection against fraudulent transactions.

What does the future hold for online shopping & older people?

As our population ages, there is a growing demand for accessible & convenient shopping options. Retailers are recognising this and are investing in making their online stores more user-friendly to the needs of older customers with voice activated assistants & virtual reality.
