WHAT NEXT? A National Digital Identity

Currently Australians can create a Digital Identity to access government services using the Australian Government's MyGovID. Over 10million people are reported to have a MyGov ID. Now the Fed. Gov. has indicated there will soon be a <u>National Digital ID for all</u>.

When would you use a National Digital ID?

You would use your ID when applying for a new credit card, rental tenancy, passport, phone service or insurance product etc. Those members who recently applied for energy rebates would know how proving **who you are**, can sometimes be very tiresome. In addition, sharing your identifying documents with multiple companies brings risks—the **Optus & Medibank hacks**. It is believed, a National ID would alleviate these risks.

How will it work?

A National Digital ID would allow you to quickly and easily identify yourself without needing to provide <u>'points of identity'</u> through passports, licences and bills. A National ID would be an <u>app</u> in your phone, laptop or desk top computer that stores a mathematical representation of <u>uniquely you</u>! We are told there would be no possibility of reverse engineering the information ie address, date of birth etc.

How does the App Work?

Using your personal biometrics (facial image, fingerprint) an <u>ever-changing</u> long mathematical code is sent identifying you to the business or government agency.

No personal data is stored!

It is believed the system will be regulated by the ACCC Australian Competition and Consumer

before a government body is organised to focus on digital regulation.

Why do we need a National ID?

Current methods of proving one's ID require too much information. It is an unnecessary privacy breach and dangerous regarding identity fraud– even one's physical security. You don't need to tell unknown parties where you live if the transaction doesn't need it. We are told, a National Digital ID is about securing & protecting our information.
